### Opportunity to Serve

The Welcome Committee is seeking a new member who will be in charge of preparing the Stoneybrook Single Family Residents' Directory. The duties of the position are as follows: update name list in Microsoft Outlook on a monthly basis (15 minutes per month), compile all sections of the directory for printing and coordinate production with The UPS Store (5 – 7 hours in January) and attend quarterly committee meetings (1 hour per quarter). The position requires moderate computer literacy and a computer with Microsoft Outlook (part of Microsoft Office). Written step-by-step procedures are available to follow. This is a great way to serve the Stoneybrook Village community with a minimal time commitment and to create something highly valued by fellow residents. ### Tree Removals and Replacements

Recently the Board commissioned a licensed arborist to assess the health of Village trees and recommend action. In his report the arborist identified several trees that are dead, or clearly diseased and likely to die soon. Logan Norris, Chair of our Tree Committee reports that the Committee has studied the report and approved the removal of 14 trees (all Birch trees) which are flagged with bright pink tape and located as follows:

- 4 trees behind the clubhouse
- 1 tree behind 4683 Hollyhock Circle
- 3 trees east of Stoneybrook Street between clubhouse and Country Club Dr.
- 4 trees east of Stoneybrook Street at corner of Country Club Dr.
- 1 tree on Country Club Drive between bus stop and 49<sup>th</sup> Street
- 1 tree on Country Club Drive between pond and bus stop

The removal work has been put out for bid and will progress as soon as bids are received and approved. A final decision on the choice of replacement trees is still pending.

### Landscape and Watering Concerns

### Summertime Emergency Preparedness Tip
