Did you know?? - As a reminder to residents in Stoneybrook, as a condition of their contract with SVOA, TruGreen Landcare prunes all shrubs in your front yard except for azaleas, rhododendrons, roses, topiaries or hydrangeas. These plants do not receive any service from TruGreen. In addition to the aesthetic pruning you might enjoy performing on these plants, you may want to trim them off your siding as well if they grow too close to your house. TruGreen does not prune any of the shrubs in the side yards between the houses.

Association Information Editor Needed – The Communications Committee is responsible for the preparation of Association Information (the document you are now reading) and the editor is a member of the committee. The work involves putting together information that is important to our residents regarding the workings of our Association. The sources of the information include Board meetings, our management company, committee chairs, etc. The time commitment for this work is probably about two hours per month.
