



Evergreen Huckleberry is a prized addition to any Northwest native landscape with its little urn-shaped flowers, perennial leaves and glossy, blackish-purple berries.

Longleaf Mahonia

This evergreen shrub will grow 2-4' tall and 3' wide. It has green leaves with yellow flowers that bloom in the spring by blue berries.

Blue Oat Grass

Graceful fountains of silver-blue blades form neat ornamental clumps that combine well with other grasses. Beige to light brown terminal panicles appear June through August. Reliable and attractive accent or specimen, perfect for rock gardens. Evergreen perennial.



Coneflower Coneflower is a native North American perennial sporting daisylike flowers with raised centers. coneflowers are a long-flowering perennial for borders, wildflower meadows, and prairie gardens. Blooming midsummer to fall, the plants are relatively drought-tolerant and rarely bothered by pests. The flowers are a

magnet for butterflies, and the seeds in the dried flower heads attract songbirds. Flower colors include rose, purple, pink, and white, plus a new orange variety. Plants grow 2 to 4 feet tall, depending on variety.



Spireas are small to medium sized deciduous shrubs that produce cascades of flowers in spring and summer. Easy care/low maintenance Among the easiest flowering shrubs to grow, spireas are often used in foundation plantings, as hedges, and in perennial gardens. Most spireas bloom in late spring to midsummer. Flower colors include pink, red, yellow, and white, depending on the variety. Some types have colorful fall foliage.



Camas Lily The Camassia lily bulb (*Camassiaquamash* syn. *Camassiaesculenta*) is a beautiful spring blooming, native North American plant that will grow in [USDA plant hardiness zones](#) 3-8.



If you are looking for a plant that is tough as nails and blooms from spring through fall, then gaura may be a fit for your garden. Gaura is a Texas native that loves full sun and tolerates drought. Gaura is an upright growing plant that grows in clumps that can be 2' to 4' high and just as wide. The leaves are long and skinny with slightly serrated leaves. The plant produces long, thin stalks that are often red to burgundy in color. The inch long flowers have four petals and grow along these stems. The flowers can range in color from white to deep magenta and they drop after full bloom.
