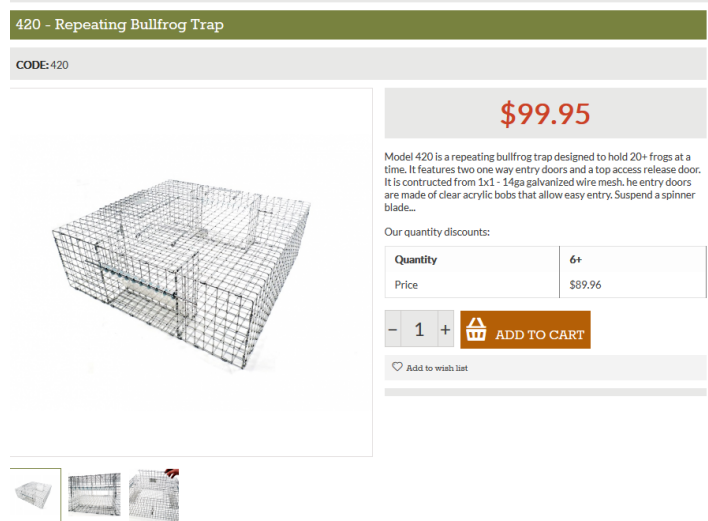


POND REPORT JULY 2016

I. Bullfrog extraction.

With an eye towards achieving a longer-term solution to bullfrog extraction, we are purchasing a Tomahawk Live Trap Model 420, “repeating bullfrog trap” for \$126.41. Oakley will be submitting an invoice to WCM. In discussing the placement and maintenance of the trap, Gaia could during their bi-weekly maintenance, review the contents of the trap. Upon placement of the trap in the pond, we will be discussing the process of removal.

II. Walk around with Tony Livermore, Supervisor, Gaia Landscapes, Inc.

Monday, July 11, 2016, Tony and I walked our ponds and surrounding landscaping for which they are responsible under contract. We reviewed all aspects of the contract and observed the following:

I. SVOA Ponds.

- Not only has the monthly application of beneficial bacteria and bio socks decreased significantly the noxious odors previously experienced prior to this application, but also the application has removed more of the algae than anticipated.
- South fountain has been repaired.
- Several invasive pond weeds, such as water clover and filamentous algae, are growing. Gaia will be investigating further efforts to remove the water clover which cannot be removed by hand.

II. SVOA Landscaping around Ponds. Performed bi-weekly.

- Lawn Service – with appropriate applications for crane fly, crabgrass, moss control having been performed, lawns look well-cared for.
- Shrubs & Beds Service – weeds were under control; shrubs pruned.

III. Irrigation. Now that Gaia has the key to the controller for irrigation should future power outages occur and irrigation is working well and appropriate fertilizer applied, the grass and surrounding shrubs and other plantings look healthy.
