

POND REPORT MAY 2017

1. Walk around with Tony Livermore, Supervisor, GAIA Landscapes, Inc.

Thursday May 4, 2019, Tony and I walked our ponds and surrounding landscaping for which they are responsible under contract, including the condition of the SVOA Monument. We reviewed all aspects of the contract and reserve item for the pump house and observed the following:

- PUMP House Paint – Tony submitted GAIA’s estimate to prepare and paint the pump house one coat same color at \$425.00. Work will be done this year.
 - SVOA Ponds.
 - Fountains are installed; weeds sprayed. Water temperature is up enabling the ponds to have their usual inhabitants.
 - SVOA Landscaping around Ponds. Performed bi-weekly.
 - Lawn Service – spring applications of thatch removal, soil loosening, seeding and lightly covering with organic mulch continues.
 - Shrubs & Beds Service – weeds are under control; shrubs pruned.
 - Irrigation.
 - No issues to report.
2. Both the Pond and ARC Committees have approved the North Pond improvement. During the summer, GAIA will be installing boulders, gravel, and other non-plant work; in the fall plantings will be done.
 3. GAIA will be submitting a proposal to repair of Stoneybrook Monument logos at north pond entrance. Work includes: “The blue section of the marquee sign that says “Village” is a thin metal strip screwed onto a piece of plexiglass. That plexiglass is attached to the main sign but has come loose and needs to be reattached and a bead of silicone applied for weather- proofing. The metal sign then needs to be screwed back onto the plexiglass once repaired.”
