EMERGENCY TIP OF THE MONTH(provided by the Preparedness Committee)

What did you do when the lights went out? What if it had extended over several hours/days? Here are some tips to consider:

- Locate your flashlight or other means of light
- Check to see if neighbors have lights
- If so, check your circuit breaker
- If not, call your power company (if you use a cable company for your landline, you will not have a working land phone)
- Know how to turn on your fire place for warmth
- Locate extra clothing or blankets for additional warmth
- Make sure you have food sources and ways to prepare food, if over a long duration, such as an outside grill or camp stove
- Keep some lights turned on so you will know when the electricity has resumed

TREE COMMITTEE and LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE

The purpose of this message is to alert you to what is underway and why as it relates to landscaping and tree management in the Village.

Pruning vegetation near sidewalks. To ensure safety for residents we are being aggressive about pruning shrubs that can grow into the sidewalk area. We are having them pruned back about 6 inches from the sidewalk. This makes them unsightly initially, but we are confident almost all will grow out and then we can maintain them at a distance that will keep the sidewalk clear. Please be patient while we get this under control.

The Tree Committee is going to contract for pruning of many (perhaps most) of the trees in the common area along 49th street. The trees to be included are marked with bright pink ribbon. Street trees are not included because these are the responsibility of the City. Trees in private yards also are not included because they are the responsibility of the owner. The purpose of the pruning is to protect humans and private property, and to achieve tree form that is able to resist weather damage and is attractive. All work will be done as directed by a certified arborist.

Following are the NLS landscaping goals for February:

- Finish all the pruning and bed grooming across the community
- Mow all the St. John's Wort along 49th Street
- Apply pre-emergent herbicide to all beds to help prevent weed germination
- Treat all turf panels for moss and spot treat the turf for cranelfy
- Touch up mow as needed
- Soft edge all turf panels as weather allows
