OUR BEAUTIFUL POND

The City of Corvallis designated the pond at Stoneybrook as a storm water detention pond. Thepurpose of the detention pond is to filter pollutants from the storm water runoff including sediment, phosphorus and nitrogen from fertilizers, salts, and oil/grease from roads and parking surfaces, and bacteria from pet waste. It is the intent of the SVOA to maintain the pond primarily for this purpose inthe most cost-effective manner possible. This includes using appropriate aquatic chemical weed and algae control in the fall when hand-removal is not sufficient to maintain a level of water clarity and to prevent unpleasant and noxious odors from the pond. The secondary purpose of the pond and surrounding area is as a pocket park to enhance the neighborhood for the enjoyment of the residents. The Pond Committee, in coordination with GAIA Landscape strive to fulfill this goal by enhancing the surrounding pond landscaping yearly through its improvementprojects.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Changes to Homes or Grounds: Most exterior modifications of homes in Stoneybrook Village require approval of the Architectural Review Committee (ARC). This includes, but not limited to, retaining walls, drainage changes, lighting, pergolas, awnings, fences, screens, trellises, skylights, debris enclosures, antennas, exterior painting, significant landscape changes, railings/hand holds.
