<u>BOARD MEETINGS:</u> The next Board meeting is 9 am November 12 (Hope you will attend). Minutes are provided in the monthly mailings and full committee reports can be found on the SVOA website (<u>www.svoa-corvallis.org</u>).

BOARD POSITIONS. Your Village Needs You! There will be TWO 2-year vacancies on the Board to be filled by an election at the Hone Owners Association annual meeting in December. This is a good opportunity for you to give back to our community. Please step up and help the Village with this important job. Ask for information about Board service from any current member of the Board (Steve Napack, Tony Olsen, Kendall Clapper, Mike Propst or Logan Norris), and please let Steve Napack know if you are interested.

<u>LANDSCAPE SERVICES.</u> Here is the NLS priority list forfall and the specifics for October and November. Normal weekly activities like mowing, edging and weed spray are also included.

Fall Priorities Overview:

Pre-dormant spray for problem weeds (blackberries, poison oak, and horsetail). Reduce irrigation as weather cools, turn off and drain by Thanksgiving.

Fall fertilize trees, shrubs, and groundcover as needed to stimulate root growth.

Reduce mowing frequency as growth slows.

Lower mowing height.

Finish all bed work and pruning prior to leaf removal.

Start leaf removal.

Late fall fertilize turf.

Plant winter annuals.

Pre-emergent.

Specifics for October and November

October:

- 1. Spray blackberries.
- 2. Spray weeds as needed.
- 3. Leaf removal as needed; use power blowers, leaf vacuum.
- 4. Reduce irrigation on turf to once per week,

shut-off irrigation to beds;

when possible, shut off all irrigation and drain system.

- 5. Lower mowing heights if raised during the summer.
- 6. Mowings will be skipped to concentrate on leaf removal.
- 7. Finish all bed work late in month.
- 8. Install fresh potting soil to all annual beds plant pansies whereapplicable.

November:

- 1. Concentrate primarily on leaf removal.
- 2. Shut off and drain all irrigation systems by Thanksgiving.
- 3. Mowings: one or two, as needed.
- 4. Continue spot spraying.

If you have concerns about dead limbs, etc. from trees in the park strips, you can contact the City of Corvallis directly at publicworks@corvallisoregon.gov, or contact the village manager at 541-602-1775.
